

Percent of PPD injured workers with any paid SJDB increased slightly over time for 2011-2014 injuries

	Injury Year	% PPD injuries with any paid SDJB						
	2011	2.38%						
	2012	2.06%						
	2013	5.03%						
	2014	5.02%						

Just over half use full \$6K allowance

- 47% of SJDB cases have less than \$6,000 SJDB paid
- Average paid SJDB per case is \$4,600 for 2013-2014 injuries
- 60% of SJDB recipients begin to receive benefit from one to three years after date of injury






Sociodemographics of SJDB program recipients

- Mostly male (42% female)
- Average age is 43.5 years
- Average weekly wage is \$634.49
- 43% live in a zip code associated with low English literacy
- 31% live in a zip code associated with low internet access
- Half live in Southern California (30% in Los Angeles)



A closer look: Labor and maintenance occupations comprise a third of SJDB recipient claims

- Labor occupations = 23% (vs. 13% for all WC claims)
 - Labor includes general labor, mover, loader, warehouse worker, roofer, construction worker, tree trimmer, heavy load workers
 - 15% injuries caused by slips, trips, or falls (vs. 6.5% in all claims)
 - 14% injuries caused by lifting (vs. 9.5% in all claims)
- Maintenance occupations = 13% (vs. 11% for all WC claims)
 - Maintenance includes housekeeping, cooking, janitors, caregivers
 - 20% injuries caused by slips, trips, or falls (vs. 6.5% in all claims)
 - 15% injuries caused by lifting (vs. 9.5% in all claims)
